Synopsis

The moment after drunken and depressed divorcee Tom falls over his second-story banister to his death, he unknowingly awakens in the afterlife to find things haven't changed too much...that is until Angie, District Ghost Manager, arrives and rules Tom's death a suicide. Tom is grounded to remain in his home by a spectral force field until the date of his trial to determine if he will be sent to heaven or hell. Things don't look great for his redemption, because when it comes to good deeds from his life, he is running a major deficit. There's hope, though, because the accounting of the good and the bad continues in the afterlife.

When workaholic Albert, his tirelessly loyal wife Karen, and their ghost-seeing daughter Sara Beth move in, Tom sees an opportunity to bolster his chances of getting into heaven. But as Tom tries to introduce himself things go awry quickly, with Tom scaring the family more than helping them. After several attempts at "exorcising" the ghost, Sarah Beth intervenes; introductions are made, and Tom becomes a daily fixture in their lives.


As Tom becomes closer to the family, his intentions begin to change, and his real redemption begins.



GHOST IN THE FAMILY is a personal film. It may not seem that way when viewing it, but it is. I recall watching Tobe Hooper's Poltergeist a few years ago and brainstorming a film from the ghost's perspective. This has been done a few times, Sixth Sense being a major example.

My initial thoughts were to use the familiar haunted house idea but write it from the view of the ghost. Instead of being a malevolent force, my ghost would be a normal guy. I named him Tom, and the story started from there. This would be a tale of redemption. A man who uses the other side as a means to make up for mistakes in his own life. Instead of haunting the family that moves into his home, he would try to help them. Only he's a ghost, and therefore conflict and humor arise.

My goal was also to make a family friendly film that still dealt with deeper themes, like the PG films of the 80's. I think kids are a lot smarter than we give them credit for. Many kid's movies these days not only talk down to kids, but also leave little room for parent enjoyment. I wanted to make a film that the whole family could have fun with. The humor was a major aspect in this. The screenplay went through multiple drafts and changes as we started to prep the film, but these ideas stayed."







Ghost in the Family was the result of an entrepreneurial idea that morphed into an 800 lb. gorilla for me and my production company, Creative Lexington.

I started Creative Lexington to produce short-format, original content for the international digital-signage content company Digichief, which I co-own. This content was five-minute, biographical videos, called Snapshot Bios, on creative types from an opera singer to a tattoo artist. Who would have known that dipping my toe into the unfamiliar waters of film making would stir my creative spirit and boost my entrepreneurial drive?

I fell in love with film in short order. My mentality, being an eight-time Ironman triathlete, is "go big or go home." So, I kicked it up a notch or two and set my sights on the big screen, and planted the seed of doing a feature film in my brain. But, that seed laid dormant for several years because you have to live life on life's terms. At each turn of the calendar year though, I would feel that punch in my gut about why haven't you done this yet? My "Come to Jesus" moment came at the beginning of 2016 when I realized that if I did not do this, I would regret it 10 years from now.

So here we go! So, how did we land on the screenplay **Ghost in the Family** to produce as our first feature? We did it the old fashion way . . . yeah right. We held a screenplay competition with a generous prize. We received more than 400 entries from all over the world, which our judges whittled down to six finalists based on the criteria that it had to be: 1) Filmed in Kentucky; 2) Rated PG-13 or below; and 3) Budget friendly, so no period pieces.

GitF, which won the grand prize, is from a talented young writer who had just graduated film studies at the University of Kentucky and is getting his MFA in screenwriting at Asbury University.

Creative Lexington is now excited to present our family-friendly, feature film to you. We did not compromise on quality, and are proud that the film highlights our fine city of Lexington, Ky., and uses a cast and crew largely from Kentucky.


